CAMPAIGN UPDATE

Reason to Be Proud Campaign is Winding Down

We Still Need YOU to Make our Campaign a Success

We have reported the success of our Reason to be Proud campaign over the last five years, with our \$1.7 million renovated house re-opened last year in time for the fall 2008 semester. We did a complete basement-to-topfloor renovation, with all plumbing, electrical and heating systems completely brought up to 21st century standards. We are one of only half a dozen or so of the 48 fraternities at Penn State that have had a complete top-to-bottom renovation in the last five years. This was the largest renovation of the house since it opened in 1927.

A recent Collegian article noted that there are a number of social fraternities at Penn State that have no houses. Still others are "gypsy" houses, moving from one vacant fraternity or rooming house to another each year. Phi Delta Theta's chapter has been shut down, with its house being rented by another fraternity. Beta Theta Pi, after a \$7 million renovation, has closed its chapter, and is planning to recolonize. It was the collective efforts of over 220 of our alums who donated their time and money to ensure our beloved Kappa Chapter did not meet the same fate as these other houses. If you have not visited our chapter house, we hope you do soon.

We Still Need Your Support

Though our campaign is winding down, we still need your support. We have a mortgage of just under \$1 million, which was necessary to finance the \$1.4 million in construction costs. If you are one of the 700+ Kappa Chapter alumni who have not yet made a contribution to this momentous effort, now is the time to show your support. Most of our campaign pledges are paid over a five-year period, and any money we raise now will be used to reduce the mortgage and cover some other items not covered by the construction project (media room floor, shutters, re-pointing the masonry).



You can make a big difference in the completion of this project for as little as \$50 per month, through a direct withdrawl from your checking or deposit account for five years, which would amount to a \$3,000 pledge. If another 150 brothers follow this plan, we will raise an additional \$150,000 of much-needed financial support.

If you have already pledged and would like to increase your level of support, please let me know and we can work to increase your pledge.

Recognizing our Loyal Donors

All campaign donors will be recognized on the Reason to be Proud campaign memorial plaque, which will be unveiled at our 2010 Founders' Day celebration. Naming opportunities for common rooms and bedrooms are also available. Find more information, including a pledge form, at www.phisigpsu.com.



From Initiation to "I Do", the Kappa Chapter House Holds Many Memories for Steve Brose '69

Steve Honored with Penn State's Liberal Arts Centennial Fellows Award

Many brothers can say that they have a strong connection to the fraternity house that they called home for a number of years throughout college. Not many, however, can say that it is also where they chose to say "I do." **Steve Brose '69** and his wife Jan were married at Phi Sig, largely because of the bond they both felt to the house and to its brothers. They have now been married for 40 years.

Steve first heard about Phi Sigma Kappa from Jim Gorman '66, a dorm counselor his freshman year who was a brother. "Jim encouraged a few of us from my floor to go out and see the house," Steve said. Feeling the most comfortable among the Phi Sig brotherhood, he and some fellow dorm residents decided to pledge. After Graduation, a Fulfilling Experience in the Field of Law

After graduating from Penn State, Steve attended Columbia Law School in New York. He worked for a federal appeals judge for a year before moving to Washington D.C., where he joined the law firm of Steptoe & Johnson law firm in Washington, D.C. He has been there ever since. While it is incredibly uncommon to settle at one firm so early into a career, Steve has now been there for 36 years, describing the experience as "very, very fulfilling."

While being a lawyer can be very time-consuming, Steve makes it a point to give back to both Penn State and Phi Sigma Kappa. He was recently honored for his contributions to the College of the Liberal Arts at its Centennial Celebration by receiving the Liberal Arts Centennial Fellows Award.
