The Alumni Board's plan is to hold an event similar to the Homecoming 2019 event, which was acclaimed as a considerable success. We plan to start at 5:00 p.m. with a cocktail hour (with live entertainment), followed by a catered buffet dinner, and then followed by a brief meeting. I'm pleased to also report that the house and Kappa's finances are in strong shape. The House looks great, thanks to the dedicated and regular efforts of Board member **David Hyland**, who serves as House Committee Chair, and to the very caring and involved Actives. Please see the article on page 2 about Work Weekend and a very successful effort to maintain and improve the House for the start of the new school year.

The financial position is strong, which is directly due to the Board's stewardship. As I have described before, the Board adopts two separate budgets—one for housing and a second for alumni association activities. We have been successful in running the housing P&L at a surplus, which is being used to make the additional payments to principal. As a result, the mortgage debt has been reduced to about \$275,000 and we are on track to pay off the mortgage by no later than the end of 2023.

Thanks to all those who stepped up. We are looking forward to seeing new and old faces again next summer!


Work Weekend 2021 Attendees and Accomplishments
